 National Task Force on Health Information (1991) → "Health Info Coordinating Council", common concepts and definitions, personoriented info, "GDP of Health"

 Formation of Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI) (1994)

# **Brief History of Canadian Health Info Initiatives (cont'd)**

- x-country consultations (1998) → Health Info
   Roadmap → Feb 99 Federal Budget (\$\$\$)
  - How healthy are Canadians?
  - How healthy is the health care system?
- Health Info-Structure Report (1997) →
   Advisory Ctte on Health Info (1999) → 10 year
   Blueprint + 2 year Tactical Plan (2000)
  - Federal / Provincial cooperation
  - electronic patient record
  - harmonized privacy legislation

# Broadly Agreed Priorities / Objectives

- Common concepts and definitions
- Spanning the "continuum of care"
- Costs -connected to- interventions
- -connected to- outcomes
- Inter-operable systems / integrable data
- Person-oriented information
- Collect once, use many
- Front line data providers should find the data directly useful
- Info for the general public as well as for system managers (demand for local data)


## A Few Comments on Privacy of Health Information

- No central mega-databases
- Consent requested whenever possible
  - 94% of NPHS respondents agree to give Statistics Canada access to their health care administrative records

Research Data Centres

• Research / analytical ← administrative uses

#### NPHS Linked Sample Data Structure



- personal interview content (socio-demographic, disability, etc. + info for other family members)
- health care service encounter (e.g. hospital inpatient stay; date, diagnosis, procedures, etc.)
- attributes of person's geographic neighbourhood

# Statistics Canada's Community Health Survey

- Complement to NPHS
- Provide sub-provincial, health region level data
- Cross-sectional, large sample every other year
- n = 130,000; minimum 500 per region
- Focus on health status and risk factors
- Some regional variation in questionnaires
- Permission to link to health care records
- Sub-samples focusing on physical measures

# Person-Oriented Information (POI) / Longitudinal Health Histories

- Pilot projects already begun
- Hospital morbidity + mortality linkage
- "five provinces" pilot project in Canadian Population Health Initiative (CPHI) and plans to fund / link research "nodes"
- Morbidity + mortality + cancer registry
- Partnership being developed with disease surveillance
  - disease registries ultimately only subsets of proper POI system
  - POI much more powerful, e.g. co-morbidities

#### Reporting on Health

- First joint annual reports from Statistics Canada and CIHI
  - How Healthy are Canadians? March 31,
  - Health Services: First Annual Report, April 26
- Indicators focus at health region
- Measurement of health status
  - currently no international standard
  - conference planned for Fall 2000

### International Comparability

- Accepted in economic statistics
- In health, widely adopted standards only for "disease" (ICD)
- Why not also for health status
- (e.g. disability) ?
- U.S. leadership ICE

#### Lessons

- Definition and agreement to "Standards" does not necessarily lead to standard collection
- Cooperation from a vast number of interests
- Consult, consult, consult
- Public is amazed by what we do not know
- Long term investment is needed
