Challenges for the Next Decade

- National coordination for measuring and monitoring
 - health status
 - quality, effectiveness and efficiency of health service provision
 - Mealth service access and utilization
- Optimizing the opportunity for capture of relevant individual and population health information in the electronic health record
- Strategic leveraging of new sources of health data

Challenges for the Next Decade

Harness the potential for improvement of health and health care with the dramatic expansion of new data elements and measurement

- Develop leadership and expertise in data aggregation and analysis to address relevant clinical issues in health and health care
- Develop methods to acquire outcomes data directly from individuals for efficient ongoing surveillance of population health status

Challenges for the Next Decade

- Measurement with *Individuals* at the center
 - Individuals play active role in their health information through Personal Health Records and tethered EHRs with relevant clinical information and decision support
 - Outcomes assessment reflects the voice of *Individuals*, including
 - Functional status as a measure of outcome
 - Expansion of measurement of satisfaction with care experience through surveys
