#### The Need to Test Standards and Operating Rules



WEDI believes that it would be prudent for the Secretary of HHS to consider pilot testing all standards and operating rules prior to their adoption.

- Reveal materials weaknesses in the standards and operating rules prior to implementation
- Evaluate the ROI / value and cost associated with such changes prior to recommending their adoption
- HHS set aside a budget for such a purpose

Should the RC evaluation criteria be used to evaluate new/proposed standards and operating rules?



Yes, the evaluation criteria should be used to evaluate both existing and new/proposed standards and operating rules.

All standards and operating rules should be evaluated by the same criteria so they all meet the same principles.

# What process(s) should be used to evaluate standards and operating rules?



We recommend that the Review Committee conduct hearings and surveys to develop a relative assessment of standards and operating rules utilizing the evaluation criteria submitted.

For the proposed evaluation criteria, the following score key has been developed.

Score Key	Standards and operating rules that score 0-28 do not meet
1 – Poor	current industry business needs and therefore there is a need to
2 – Fair	adopt a different standard or operating rule.
3 - Good	
4 - Very Good	Standards and operating rules that score 29-53 do not meet
5 - Excellent	current industry business needs and therefore there is a need to
	move to a new version of the standard or operating rule.
	Standards and operating rules that score 54-80 meet or
	continues to meet current industry business needs and therefor
	no change is necessary.
