Outcomes and Directions

- Processed Framework V3 and drafting V4
- Promoting creation of NGO group to continue Framework and community measurement activity
- Building momentum for Federal interagency focus on multi-sectoral community indicators
- Advisory input to HHS activities such as Public Health 3.0, Healthy People, CDC and HRSA sub-county data indicator projects
- Developing report and recommendations



Timelines

- First draft of Framework Version 4 drafted and will be circulated soon
- NGO handoff occurred and evolving in early stages
- No timetable for Federal interagency work set
- NCVHS' ongoing role in HHS activities to be discussed
- First draft of workshop report written and circulated
- Broad themes for recommendations ready for discussion



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Framework Version 4

Domain	Subdomains
Community vitality	Social capital, governance, civic engagement, social inclusiveness
Demographics	Population: age, race, sex, race/ethnicity, language, disability, other?
Economy	Income, wealth, employment
Education	Infrastructure, capacity, participation, achievement
Environment	Natural, built, neighborhood characteristics
Food & Agriculture	Food availability, nutrition
Health	Care infrastructure, behaviors, conditions/diseases, outcomes
Housing	Infrastructure, capacity, quality, use & affordability
Public safety	Infrastructure, perceptions, crime, injuries
Transportation	Infrastructure, capacity, quality, use & affordability



Recommendation Themes: Federal

- View the advancement of health and well-being through a multi-sectoral framework
- Identify a home for community-level data within HHS; support this group with funding for such activity



Recommendation Themes: Federal

- Push for the establishment of an across departmental group for sub-county, community-level data. Efforts to be included are:
 - Data sharing
 - Coordinate efforts to close accessibility gaps of sub-county data through enhanced data collection or small area estimation. Support local data collection systems that mirror Federal data systems (e.g., state-level HANES)
 - Rethink Federal data collection strategies to provide more effective small area estimates (e.g., the ACS approach)
 - Develop methods and assist state development of Web-based Data Query Systems to provide local data
 - Collaboration with NGO efforts to spur community metric-centric well-being efforts



Recommendation themes: non Federal

- Transition framework activities to NGO and Foundation community
- Promote more community involvement in framework development
- Coordinate Federal-NGO small area/sub-county data generation and access
- Collaborate on provision of resources and analytic tool development for community data use
