SafePass will support the Department of Public Health's contact tracing program

LOS ANGELES — Los Angeles County Supervisor Kathryn Barger, County Department of Public Health Director Dr. Barbara Ferrer, Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti, Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia, Pasadena Mayor Terry Tornek, and Citizen CEO Andrew Frame appeared at a press conference at L.A. City Hall today to announce a partnership with SafePass, a mobile app that provides contact tracing capabilities for individuals throughout Los Angeles County.

SafePass will allow users to self-report their symptoms for COVID-19 and receive notifications and alerts directly from the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health. All contact tracing data is anonymous, private, encrypted, and deleted after 30 days by Citizen. Officials encouraged residents to download the app to expand local efforts to track COVID-19 for L.A. County's 10 million residents.







Citizen started as a "crime tracker" named Vigilante but it was immediately removed from the app store for "concerns centered around user safety"—namely, that it would encourage, yes, vigilantism.







Conclusions + Recommendations

- Public technologies in implementation is political
- Government need clear infrastructures for public testing
- Legal and contractual guard rails should be pre-deployment requirements – including pathways to dispute + wind-down
- Quality assurance goes beyond functionality and should include anticipating application in commercial, criminal, and law enforcement contexts
- Define harms based on impact, not procedure
- Invest in research oversight and public communication
