Standards Subcommittee Charge



Monitors and makes recommendations to the full NCVHS as follows:

- Identify issues and opportunities in health data standards;
- Provide outreach, liaison, and consultation with, and serve as a public forum on health information technology standards for the health care industry and federal, state and local governments;
- Make recommendations related to electronic standards and operating rules under HIPAA, privacy and security standards, health terminologies and vocabularies;
- Make recommendations on strategies to promote a continuing process of developing, coordinating, adopting, implementing and maintaining standards. These strategies may include public information and educational efforts as well as research and development efforts;
- Participate in development/publication of the Report to Congress on HIPAA Administrative Simplification
- Collaborate with other Federal Advisory Committees on cross-cutting issues as appropriate and when delegated by the Full Committee

Predictability Roadmap Priorities



➤ Focus on immediate and longer-term needs identified by industry and within the Subcommittee's charter:

- Build on prior "Predictability Roadmap" recommendations
- Improve availability and/or access to updated versions of standards
- Address clinical, administrative and other data intersections
- Support move to interoperability
- Improve regulatory processes to enable access to updated or new standards
- Improve standards update and adoption processes
- Reduce administrative burdens



Subcommittee work plan: Standardization of Information for Burden Reduction and Post-Pandemic America



Intent: Build on Predictability Roadmap and identify current industry innovative activities, priorities and burden

➤ Phase 1: Assess the current health data standards landscape

- Listening Session and Request for Written Comments (August 2021)
- Analyze the listening session information; identify issues and opportunities.
- Conceptualize potential solutions to improve efficiency and reduce burden
- Develop workplan for Phase II

➤ Phase II: Develop and refine recommendations based on assessment of standards input, industry consultation and NCVHS input

- Standards: Development, regulation, implementation, enforcement
- Convergence: Coordinate efforts with ONC and HITAC
- Identify other opportunities related to HHS priorities

Standardization of Information for Burden Reduction and Post-Pandemic America (2)



Additional opportunities that may be considered for evaluation:

- FHIR and APIs
- All-Payer Claims Databases (APCD) Common Data Layout (CDL)
Consistency of reporting and/or exchange of social risk data
- Conformance/Enforcement improvement opportunities
- Sanctioned exceptions and alternatives to HIPAA transaction standards
- Health data flows beyond traditional HIPAA and HITECH trading partners
 - Social and structural determinants of health; patient social services programs
 - Public health, infectious diseases and vital statistics
 - Pandemic-related lessons learned
 - Patient/consumer-driven data

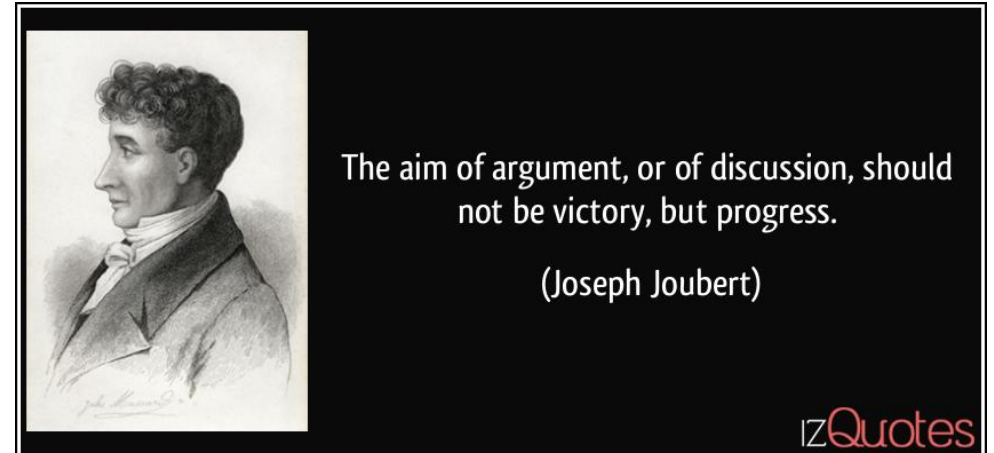

Request for Comments



Subcommittee released **Request for Comments** in June 2021:

- 30+ letters received to date
- Several with multiple signatory organizations

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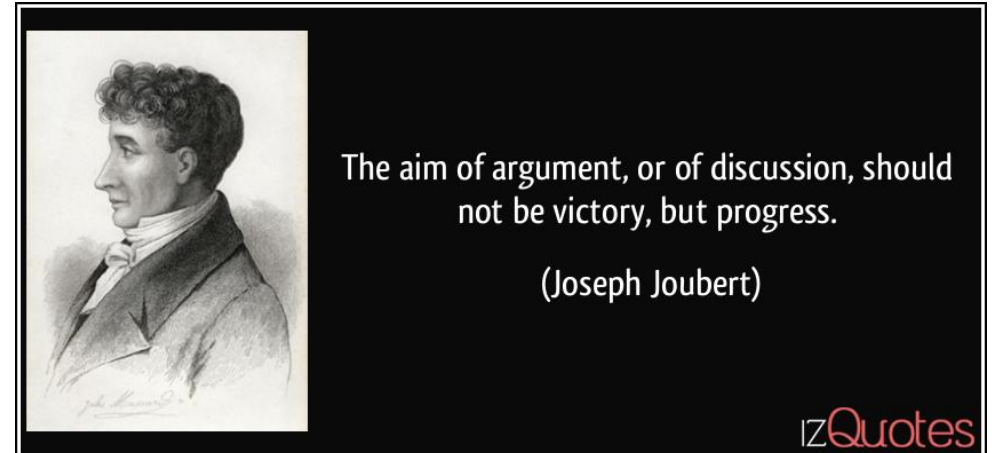

NCVHS Activities



- **Predictability Roadmap**

- Envisioning a more industry-driven standards development and adoption
- More timely updates: more frequent but smaller, more “digestible” updates
- Enhanced pre-adoption testing
- Building in ROI determination
- Enforcement/conformance

- **Terminologies/Vocabularies, ICD-11 pre-work**

- **Convergence: administrative, clinical, patient and other health data interoperability standards**

- Collaboration with ONC/HITAC: ICAD task force and more

ADOPTION OF STANDARDS:

- Adopt standard for attachments/publish attachments rule
 - Adopt standard for acknowledgements
- Adopt NCPDP Script standard for pharmacy under HIPAA
- Adopt HL7 standard for dental transactions under HIPAA vs. X12
- Evaluate standards prior to adoption/conduct testing/demonstrate ROI
 - Provide funding for pilots
- Understand benefits/uses of existing code sets
 - Adopt UDI (unique device identifier)

POLICY:

- Regulations assume all entities are covered entities
- Policies need to be fleshed out to support implementation
- Standardize prior authorization and supporting documentation through regulation
 - Focus on patient centered care
- Incorporate best practices for privacy while enabling use of third party apps
 - Create national consent model

INTEROPERABILITY:

- Work with standards development organizations to develop and test standards
- Increase exchanges with public health organizations; support public health infrastructure
- Create health care directory/end point directory
 - Patient Matching/Patient Identity
- Standardize and leverage social risk data
