

# Information Requested by Committee

How does your SDO –

1. assess and report on backward compatibility or specific anticipated issues with version updates.
2. assess whether current systems can support the functionality and the impact across mandated standards.
3. assess cost and value of changes within a standard, cost and value of the changes at the time expected to be implemented, and the cost and value of implementation of the standard in the cross- transaction environment where it will be used with other standards.
4. assess potential risks and impacts of new or updated standards across existing standards, and in consideration of potential plans for the future of ICD-11 implementation.
