This document was developed by the NCVHS Population Health Subcommittee drawing from a wide range of evidence, including an environmental scan conducted by the Committee, and with input from the public through a year-long, iterative process. This version of the Framework incorporates feedback received during the NCVHS Population Health workshop held in September 2016. In its capacity as a Federal Advisory Committee, the Committee has turned over the Framework to a non-governmental organization (NGO) whose leadership volunteered to steward its ongoing development, maturation, pilot, implementation and ongoing refinement in collaboration with federal, state, local governmental and non-governmental organizations. 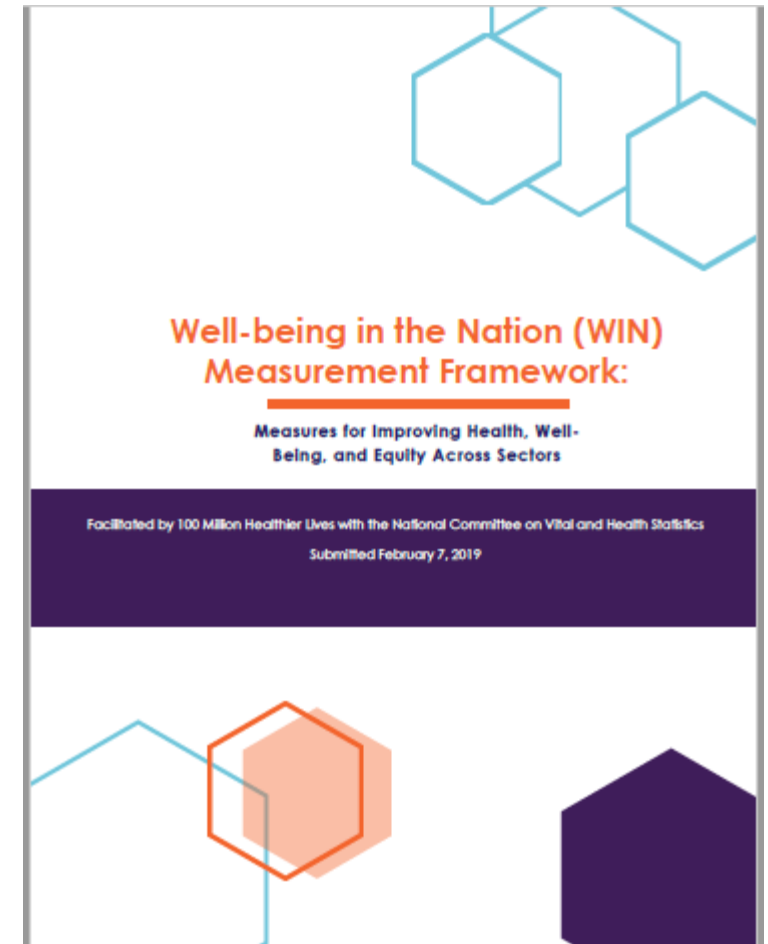

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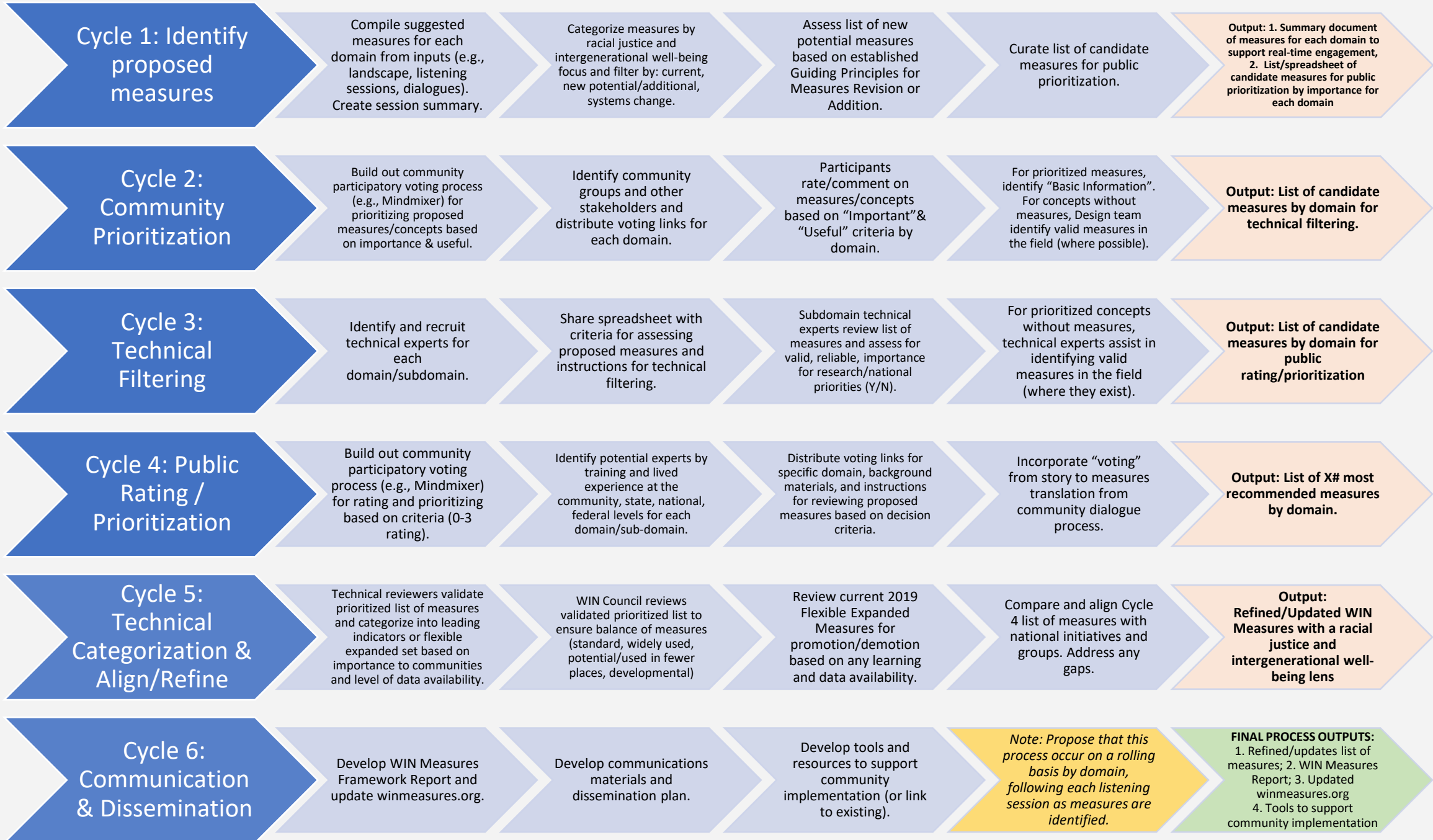

The past five years has seen a substantial increase in initiatives and activities that foster community-level multisector collaboration to advance population health. The rise in awareness of how social determinants drive health outcomes, advanced by the County Health Rankings & Roadmaps, the National Academies of Science, Engineering and Medicine, the All-In, the Practical Playbook, 100 Million Healthier Lives, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's Culture of Health initiative, and many others, have moved communities to invest in multisector collaboration to address social needs and the social determinants of health.

While there seems to be general agreement that multisector collaboration to advance population health and address social determinants, the availability of common multi-

Place is defined by people, governments, and institutions as well as by physical features: natural resources, buildings, and boundaries. Mid-America, the focus of this section, is a mosaic of every special place where communities the world is the challenge of economic, environmental, history, culture, and local experiences.

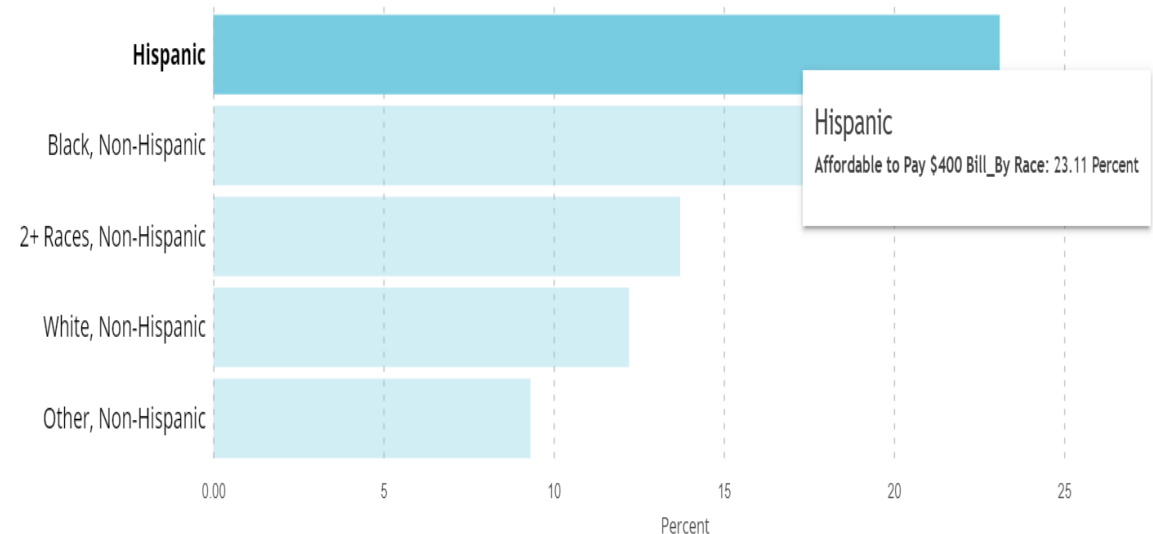

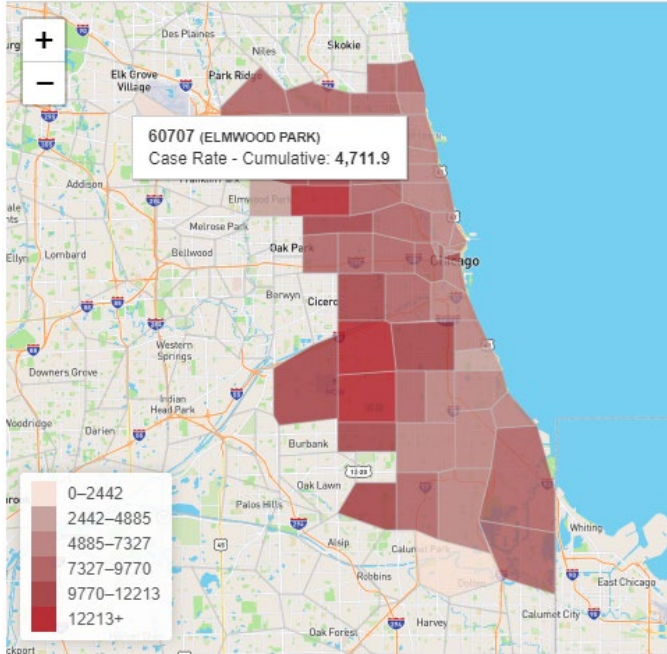

Inability to Afford a \$400 Emergency Expense, by Race/Ethnicity (2017)



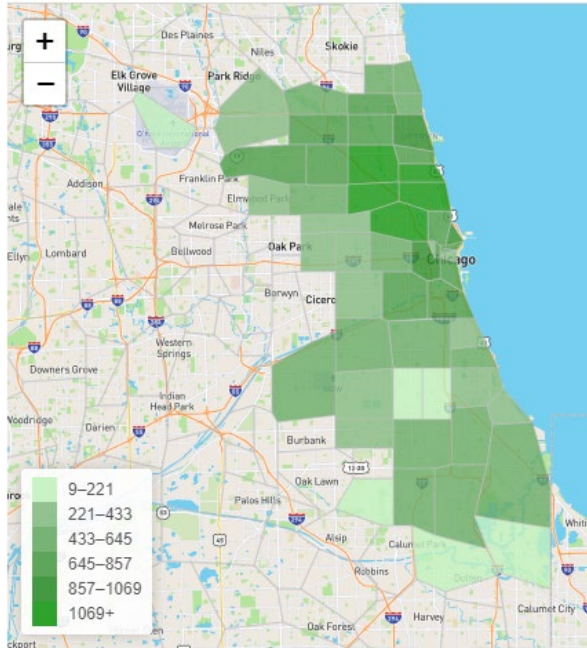
Case Rate per 100k Population

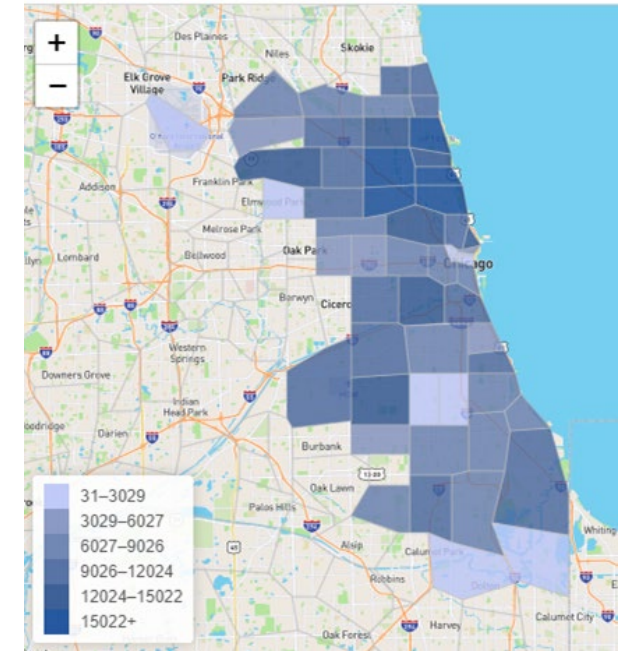
Number of Loans

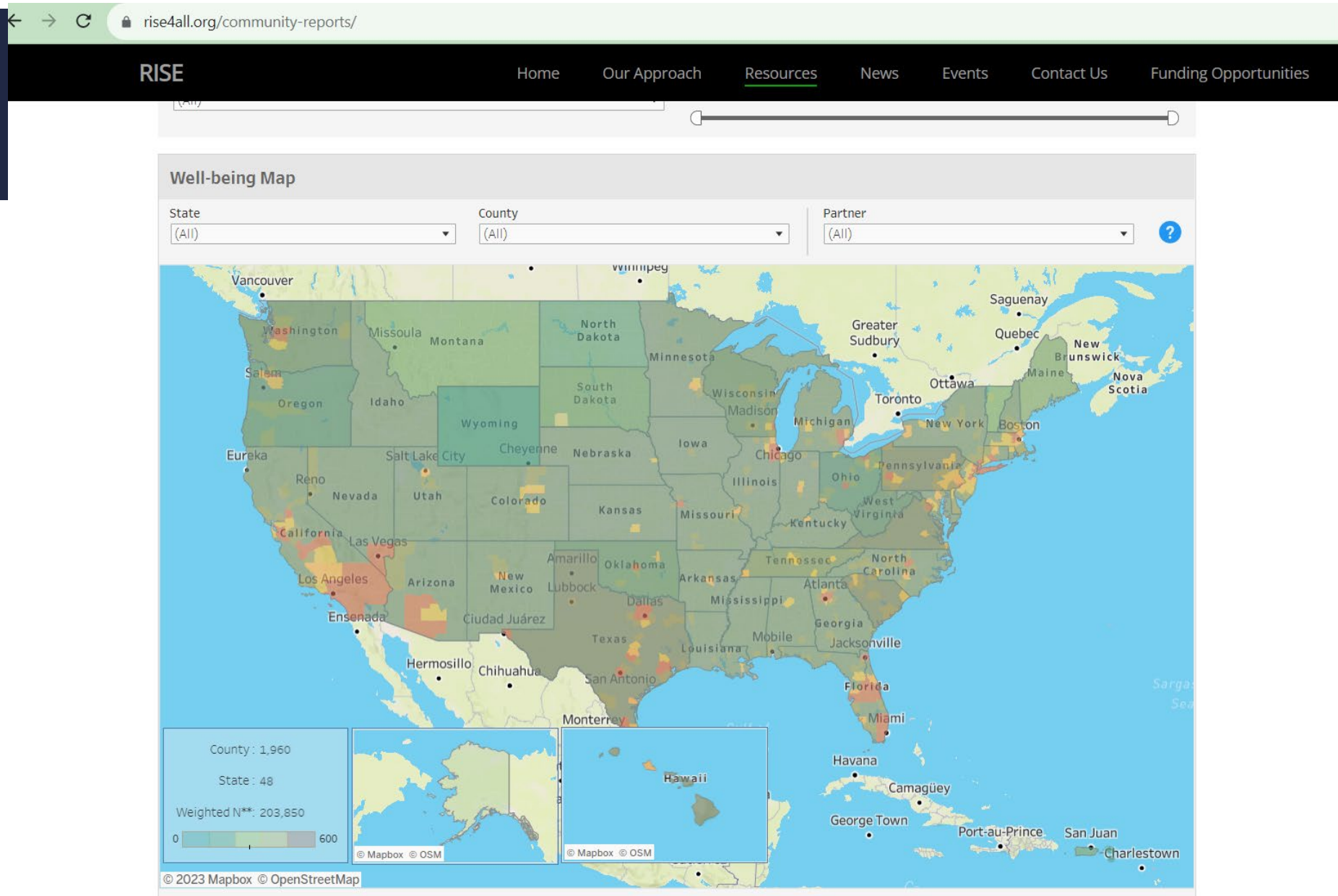

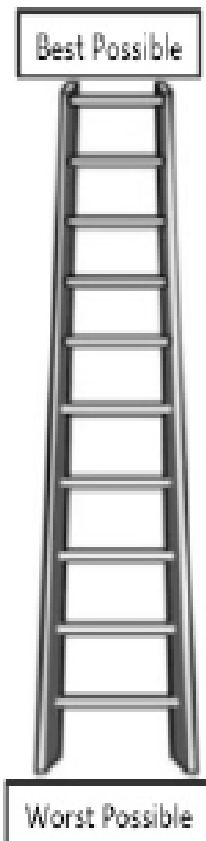
