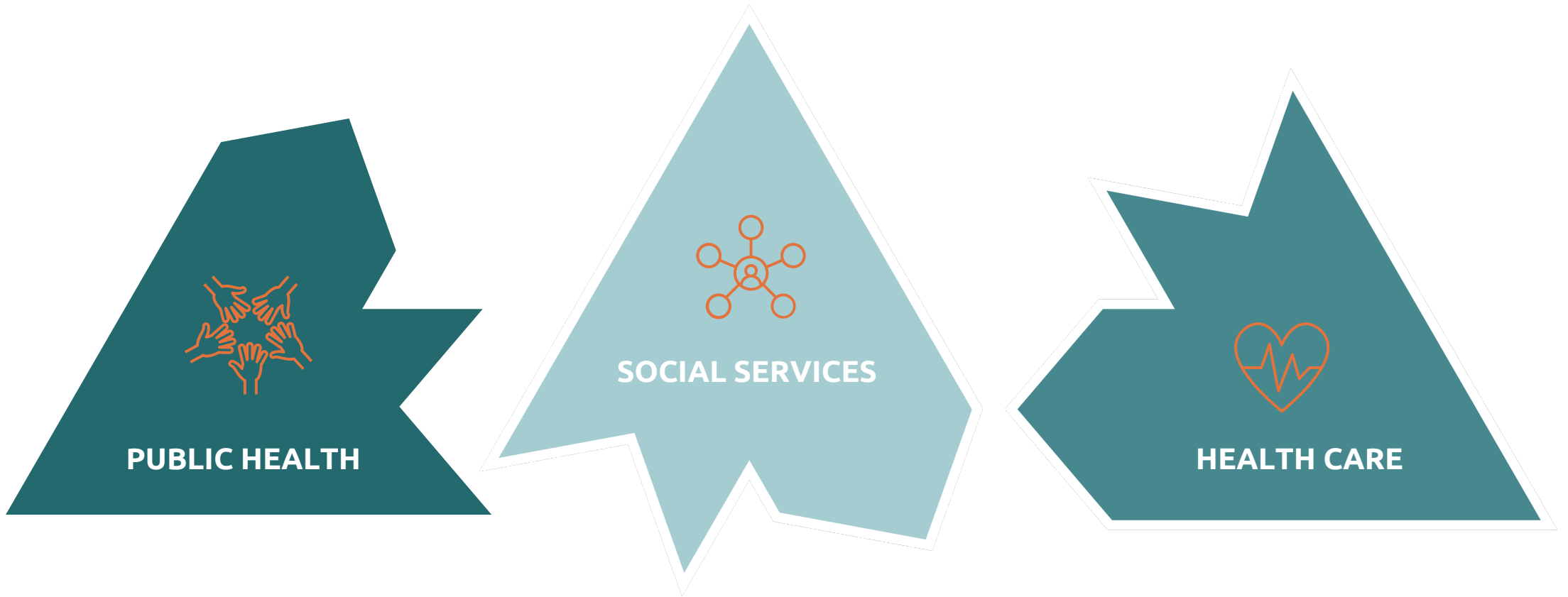

Key Strategies

- An approach for how social service information can be collected and shared with a set of national standards.
- An approach for consent management for the exchange of health, social service, and public health information.
- An approach for consistent/unified individual identification to enable information matching across data systems.

Important Considerations

- Reconcile varying state and federal requirements that may be in conflict or not fully aligned.
- Balance privacy of data with access to data for providers and care teams to deliver care and services.
- Acknowledge lack of infrastructure in public health and social services to exchange and utilize data.
