



Key Strategies

 An approach for how social service information can be collected and shared with a set of national standards.

- An approach for consent management for the exchange of health, social service, and public health information.
- An approach for consistent/unified individual identification to enable information matching across data systems.



Important Considerations

- Reconcile varying state and federal requirements that may be in conflict or not fully aligned.
- Balance privacy of data with access to data for providers and care teams to deliver care and services.

 Acknowledge lack of infrastructure in public health and social services to exchange and utilize data.
